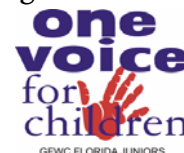

*In 1936, Marjorie G. Illig, an ASCC field representative and chair of the **General Federation of Women’s Clubs Committee on Public Health**, made an extraordinary suggestion. She proposed creating a legion of new volunteers whose sole purpose was to wage war on cancer. The Women’s Field Army, as this organization came to be called, was an enormous success. Its recruits donned khaki uniforms, complete with insignia of rank and achievement, and canvassed the streets to raise money and help educate the public. **Clarence Little**, the ASCC’s managing director at the time, wrote that “In 1935 there were 15,000 people active in cancer control throughout the United States. At the close of 1938, there were ten times that number.” More than anything else, it was the Women’s Field Army that moved the Society to the forefront of voluntary health organizations.*

*In 1945, the ASCC was reorganized as the **American Cancer Society**. Isn’t it great being part of the GFWC!*

A motion was made to keep the changes, the motion carried. This ornament will be sent to the manufacturer and it is hoped to have several available for sale at our Harvest Jubilee on Oct. 18th. Ornaments were pre-sold (approx. 150) to Florida College at a discount. Past ornaments can be purchased at the Temple Terrace Library or by contacting **Norma Walker**. Our club members will be helping to deliver Heritage Ornament orders during the month of December.

Festival of Lights (live wreaths & luminaries) has been our holiday fundraiser for many years. However, in the past few years there has been a decrease in orders and profits. Since we no longer have our Bulk Rate mailing permit, it was decided to leave the decision to continue this project up to the International Affairs department. In the past, Operation Smile (an international organization) benefitted from this.

T-Shirts/Fun Spirit Shirts – **Anita** brought samples of T-Shirts. They are black (v-neck or scoop neck) with our club name in silver rhinestones across the front of the shirt. Club members were able to try on the shirts for size before ordering.

New Name Badges – **Anita** brought samples of the new name badges we have an opportunity to purchase (cost \$12). They have a white background with the FFWC logo and our name. These new name badges conform to other clubs within the FFWC. See **Anita** to place your order.
